

About the image (Dr. Tom Frey): I took one shot about every 10 minutes leading to totality. You can see the deep red color of the sun's chromosphere...then the corona, the million degree plus atmosphere shines above the Moon's disk. I took several exposures but this s the best one. At the end of totality, I caught the diamond ring effect as the Sun reappears (front cover image). **About the meeting:** We would all be interested in where and how you observed or photographed the eclipse weather you observed just the partial or the total. We will try to give everyone 5 minutes to tell of their experiences and most memorable moments. This should be a fascinating meeting for all. Hope to see you there!

Our Sky Star Parties occur once a month, and are free and open to the public, and also weather-permitting.



NASA Announces Cassini End-of-Mission Activities

On Sept. 15, NASA's Cassini spacecraft will complete its remarkable story of exploration with an intentional plunge into Saturn's atmosphere, ending its mission after nearly 20 years in space. News briefings, photo opportunities and other media events will be held at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, California, and will air live on NASA Television and the agency's website: *https://www.nasa.gov/nasalive*
